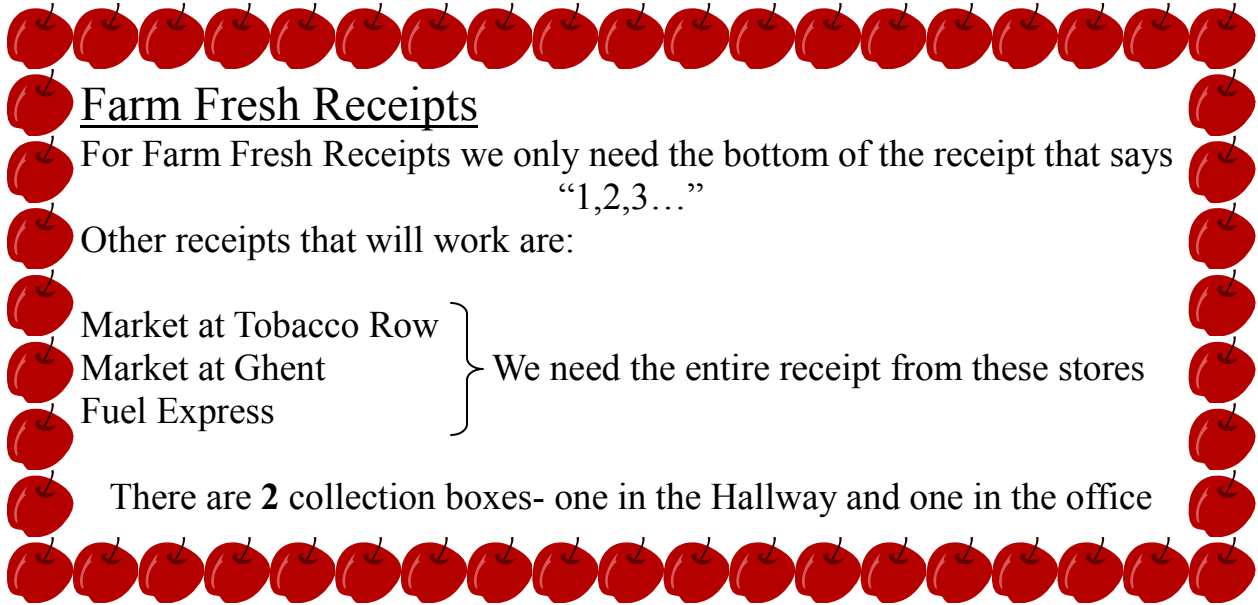
We also had two Parents, Mr. Eichenlaub and Mr. Logan help as well.

Fuel Express

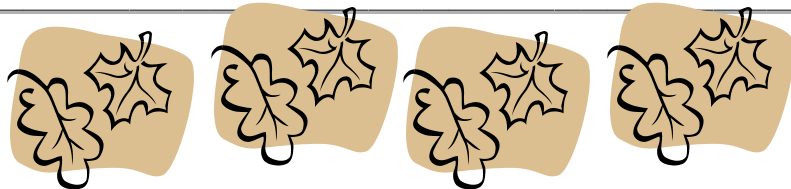
